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Clean Language questions, although appearing quite ordinary, are designed to keep your assumptions and unintended influence, as a questioner, to a minimum while providing the maximum opportunity for the other person to express themselves in their own way.



- Listener: Write 3-4 keywords you hear (metaphors or objects), so that you can interview them later






# Clean Light Activity – Round 2, 60 Seconds

- Speaker: Talk about something you really enjoy doing
- Listener: Write 3-4 keywords you hear (metaphors or objects), so that you can interview them later

- Listener: Asks Clean Language Questions from your card or a Contextually Clean Question based upon 1 of the keywords they recorded
- Speaker: Responds
